

*Just what is thrilling about **Specialised Tax Barristers** nowadays?*

Many tax barristers have an even mix of advisory and litigation work and can be instructed to advise and represent in court both taxpayers and HM Revenue and Customs. Issues relating to residence and domicile is an area that a tax barrister could advise on. Tax residence can have a serious impact on how much tax you pay and how you stay compliant with the law. Different countries have different rules to decide where you are tax resident based on factors like where you spend your time, where you work, or where you have assets or family members. Significantly, a barrister who is an expert on tax matters can provide advice to self-employed consultants on disguised remuneration legislation and third party loans including anti-avoidance provisions in Finance (No2) Act 2017. Local and other indirect taxes is a matter that tax barristers can give counsel on. Most civil tax investigations end with you and HMRC agreeing on how much tax and how much of a penalty you should pay. You don't need to go to court if this is the case. If you can't reach a mutual agreement and disagree with HMRC's decision on the case, you can make an appeal and begin litigation in either civil court or a tribunal. Under the remittance basis of taxation, a person's UK source income is still subject to UK income tax on an arising basis but his foreign source income is only subject to UK income tax if that income is remitted to the UK. A UK tax barrister will be able to take a view on your personal situation. Tax barristers may

Providing Advice In Relation To Transactions

A barrister is an advocate so it's a formal legal position which is recognized by various regulations. It's a specific position but really a barrister is someone who goes to court or tribunal and argues their client's case, sometimes writes court documents but mainly an advocate. More than a few tax barristers are able to undertake tax arbitrations either as counsel or arbitrator. Specialist pensions experts have detailed knowledge of the special rules on pensions which apply in the public sector, in particular in relation to transfers of staff to the private sector. The work of a pensions barrister includes questions about member benefits and handling all types of pensions-related claims and disputes. Civil tax investigations and inquiries will generally take place when the tax evaded is significant and can include artificial tax arrangements or avoidance schemes used to underpay tax. The opinion of a [Tax Barrister](#) service should be sort if clarification of the finer issues are required.

The context in which tax advice must be given today has changed over the last decade. Traditional taxes, new direct and indirect taxes, and European rules and impositions are now underpinned by an increasingly policy-driven approach and sometimes aggressive practice by H.M. Revenue & Customs. Advice may be sought via a written opinion and/or during a conference with the client. IHT business property relief including advising on trading status, hybrid business (caravan parks etc), reorganising group structures to minimise restrictions for excepted assets and investment subsidiaries is an area which you would need a tax barrister specialising in Private Client, IHT and Estate Planning. Length and complexity may not be ideal, but they would be acceptable if the result were a clear, efficient tax system where the line between what is within particular tax rules and what is not was clearly explained. That line is not clearly defined presently. Some tax barristers specialise in commercial arbitrations and litigation both on and offshore; banking; insurance (particularly coverage and indemnity disputes) and claims arising from the financial services sector. Advisory services such as [Inheritance Tax Advice](#) are a common sight today.

Navigating Clients

Tax experts have in-depth knowledge of all aspects of cross-border investment; the laws of multiple jurisdictions; and the use of offshore trusts and corporate structures for asset protection, privacy, security and how these issues relate to a business. A limited number of senior barristers receive 'silk' – becoming Queen's Counsel – as a mark of outstanding ability. They are normally instructed in very serious or complex cases. Most senior judges once practised as QCs. Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs service (HMRC) has a duty to

ensure that all due taxes are paid to the Crown. It therefore has the power to conduct civil and criminal investigations and seek appropriate restitution or penalties where necessary. Many cases can be resolved without the need to go to court. A barrister can discuss all of your available options including simple correspondence, round table meetings and alternative dispute resolution methods such as mediation, arbitration, adjudication and early neutral evaluation. One of the most important skills of a tax barrister is communication, the ability to explain tax issues to non-technical people so that they can understand. The fact that tax is, of course, legally defined as the property of government, which is why when consent fails it can enforce its claim to ownership of it. The technical expertise from a tax barrister, their procedural knowledge of the tax system, and their ability to negotiate settlements with the tax authorities will ensure that tax disputes are handled and resolved effectively. If the spending of tax by a government is for social objectives, and much of it will be in the case of a modern government, then tax has to be designed with that fact in mind.
