- Collect cotton swabs, paper towels, soft cloths, and a small bucket of water, depending on the stain's type, to get started.
- Blot a liquid stain by applying gentle pressure to the impacted area and using a common remover. Effective stain removers include baking soda, vinegar, dish soap, and cornstarch.
- Use a spoon to scrape out stubborn spots, or dampen a soft cloth and apply detergent to it. Once you see a result, continue to rub the area gently. The method should repeat until the desired result is received.
